2022-2023 Magnet Recruiting Report

During the LAUSD fall magnet application window, GMS received 109 on-time, first-choice applications for the 2022-2023 school year, including 98 applications for the 95 available freshman spots. We now have a short waiting list for our 2022-2023 freshman class.

Last year during the same period we had 76 total on-time applications.

GMS teachers, students and parents helped promote our program to prospective students and parents during a series of on-campus and virtual sessions. We held four two-hour, on-campus tours at Cleveland Charter High School, and four one-hour virtual Q & A sessions on Zoom.

We also attended the All-Valley Magnet Fair, and went to virtual high school information sessions at the following middle schools: Chime Charter Middle School, James Jordan Middle School, Valley Charter Middle School, Millikan and Walter Reed middle schools, and Holmes Middle School.

In addition, we contacted counselors and sent physical and electronic fliers to more than a dozen middle schools.

We deeply appreciate the enthusiasm our staff, students and parents show for the Global Media Studies Magnet, and it was apparent to the many parents and students who gave us such positive feedback and, ultimately, chose our program.

Making sure that we have students who are passionate about film and animation, and parents who are supportive of their students, will help our magnet thrive.

Students who are 12 years of age and older must have their first dose no later than Sunday, Nov. 21, and their second dose no later than Dec. 19 to meet the LAUSD deadline.
