




Frosh Field Trip Fosters Community


PROMPT: To what extent did reform movements in the United States from 1825 to 1855 lead to an expansion of democratic ideals?

The early 1800s were marked by significant economic and social change. In the aftermath of the War of 1812, the growing self-sufficient economy moved towards industrialization, a time known as the Market Revolution. People began flocking to the cities and working in factories, effectively creating the lower class and the cult of domesticity. Amid this industrialization and change, another movement took form. The Second Great Awakening was a religious revival that appealed to emotions and emphasized the faith and power of an individual. At the same time, President Andrew Jackson expanded voting rights to most white males. Together, the ideas of revivalism, individualism and suffrage eventually led to the formation of several reform movements. Although various groups continued to face oppression and lack of rights through the 19th century, the reform movements between 1825 and 1855 led to an overall expansion of democratic ideals by emphasizing and spreading ideas of morality, individualism, and equal rights.








Seven GMS Students Visit Sweden for IYMS
