





Ghetto Film School (GFS) is an award-winning nonprofit that started in 2000 (and has since been thriving) with the intention of advocating for the next generation of storytellers. Alongside its Los Angeles branch, students **Abigail Zamora** and **Sarah Brieche** were equipped with the guidance of GFS to polish their visionary intuitiveness by following the introductory education program for high school track. Altogether, the two harnessed the strategies of voice, opportunity, and perspective to establish a platform to which one could amplify a message that pushes against the margins of creative culture.

In the span of visual storytelling course, students are to receive over 1,000 hours of training synonymous to that in college (with respect to this pathway). Said courses incorporate coverage of the business and artistic side of cinematic storytelling and production while qualifying registrants to progress their educational prowess at top universities. Additionally, the program is free of charge for all students, despite it featuring instruction from industry professionals, live visits to studios, and occasional travels.

Incoming applicants are between the ages of 14 and 18. No prior filmmaking experience is required.





The International Youth Media Summit (IYMS) unifies youth from all parts of the world to organize complex, multifaceted pieces of media that emphasize a diverse perspective on modern-day conflicts. The outcome of their projects works to highlight the potential for change through the application of the quality of human integrity that ties us together. This past summer IYMS celebrated its 18th collective at La Crosse, Wisconsin, USA. In a short yet noteworthy period ranging from July 24 to August 6, the many passionate delegates met the big Summit finale deadline which screened the seven short films produced and announced the location of next year's host country for the summit as Peru.

IYMS thanks to the GMS Booster Club for providing scholarships to several Cleveland delegates, which helped defray travel expenses for them. IYMS founder **Evelyn Seubert** is an exemplary figure who made the opportunities of this venture endless. IYMS has once again proved itself to not be simply confined to favor the growth of filmmakers, but pivotal to the fluorescent bloom all our young ones encapsulate and will plant at every corner of the globe as they maneuver themselves socially conscious.

Sony Pictures Media Arts Program

The Sony Pictures Media Arts Program (SPMAP) is a free after-school animation program offered through a partnership between the City of Los Angeles Department of Cultural Affairs, the CalArts Community Arts Partnership, Sony Pictures Entertainment, and the Los Angeles Public Library. This class explores topics such as the principles of animation, animation history, comics, storyboarding, story development, character design, world building, stop motion, video creation, and much more!

SPMAP is open for students ages 11-17. All supplies are provided and no previous experience is required.

The SPMAP program consists of three separate 10-week long classes. The 2023-24 classes will be offered from October 2, 2023 - June 10, 2024 as follows:

- * Fall Session: October 2 December 16, 2023 (Register for Fall Session <u>here</u> Registration opens Friday, August 18)
- * Winter Session: January 22 March 23, 2024 (Register for Winter Session <u>here</u> beginning November 2023)
- * Spring Session: April 1 May 31, 2024 (Register for Spring Session <u>here</u> beginning February 2024)
- * Culminating Event: June 10, 2024

Breaks in between sessions coincide with CalArts academic calendar. Each session will offer indepth learning in one topic of animation determined by the teaching team at each partner site.
